2 Chronicles 20:31-21:1a

The most important mark on a tombstone is the hyphen between the two dates. That hyphen represents an entire lifetime of victory and defeat, accomplishment and failure. Merely a mark on earth, that hyphen becomes the basis for evaluation in eternity.
